Abu Hurairah رضي الله عنه narrates that a man complained to the Messenger of Allah ﷺ of hardness of the heart.

The Messenger of Allah ﷺ replied:

If you want your heart to be softened, then you must feed the needy, and pass your hand over the head of the orphan.

The Messenger of Allah ﷺ said:

Being affluent does not mean having a great amount of property, rather affluence is self contentment.
